

**iOS 8 Launches,
Android L to Launch on Samsung Devices in the Coming Months,
and Droid Turbo to be Announced Next Month.**

Aside from the well-known and well-marketed release of the iPhone 6 this week, there aren't any big headlines from the tech world this week (which is to be expected with Apple's big launch overshadowing any other story). However, there is still plenty of buzz and news out there. First is Apple-related, as the company released iOS 8, which promotes itself as the biggest update of iOS yet. Most of the new features are meant to be utilized with the new iPhone 6 and 6 Plus, but users of previous models as well as iPods and iPads can enjoy the new operating system early as it was released this Wednesday. New features include a new fitness app, more lock-screen interactions, and a platform that is open to developers to be able to create widgets and soon be able to somewhat customize applications, something iOS has been lacking from the start.

In non-Apple operating system news, it seems that Google's big update (currently called Android L) will launch on Samsung devices around the end of November. This operating system has already been tested in launches overseas and sees a completely redesigned operating face as well as smart notifications which display notifications from apps you use most frequently, and a new battery-saver system that automatically adjusts operations to seamlessly save battery life when it gets low.

Finally, this week sees word that Verizon will officially announce the next line of its exclusive Motorola Droid devices with the currently-named Droid Turbo sometime in October. With the recent release of the Moto X, it makes sense that soon we will see the announcement and release of the Verizon exclusive.



Android L, which is already available on some Nexus devices, will be out on the mass market soon.
